If you had a physical exam in the last 12 months, ask your doctor to provide you with the biometric values you'll need to complete your Personal Health Assessment.

While you have the opportunity to obtain these biometric values from a free screening offered at multiple campus sites throughout the year, you may obtain these values from your physician using this form. If you had blood work done in conjunction with your annual physical examination in the last 12 months, call your physician to request the values listed below. Completing your Personal Health Assessment (PHA) questionnaire qualifies you for a reduction in your monthly medical plan premium and also makes you eligible to participate in the Faculty and Staff Incentive Program to earn additional cash rewards.

The biometric values and the PHA must be completed **annually** to continue to receive the medical premium reduction each year. You may complete your free campus biometric screening and PHA at any time during the calendar year, but your premium reduction may not take effect until the following month and will be pro-rated for the months missed.
